## Mount Hope Memorial Capital Campaign Underway \$100,000 Grant from Browne Fund

During the past year, great progress has been made in the Mount Hope Cemetery Chinese Immigrant Memorial Project.
Thanks to a grant last year of \$20,000 from the City of Boston's Browne Fund and to the design work of Joo Kun Lim of Twinspine Architects of Somerville, the preliminary design (see figure on page 2) of the Memorial has been completed and was unveiled at the Chinese Historical Society of New England's annual membership dinner on September 20, 2000.

The design for the Memorial includes a roofed altar to be located where the current dilapidated brick altar now stands in one of the original Chinese sections of Mount Hope Cemetery. A small plaza in the auspicious octagon shape will lead to the altar. The roof of the altar will be topped off with the rising figure of a dragon, and the wall will be inscribed with four Chinese characters meaning "Remember your heritage". This altar, intended to provide visitors with a "sanctuary" for contemplation and paying
